



African Regional PAC Councils




ARAPAC – Asia







A South Pacific PAC Council

CHOGM Communique

- Commonwealth body would overlap all PAC Councils
- Communique aims to ensure all Commonwealth members agree to the fundamental requirements of a PAC

Why ACPAC should engage
