About Perth

Transport

Perth is serviced by the <u>Transperth</u> public transport network. The CBD is a free transit zone, including for the Central Area Transit (CAT) bus service which operates frequently on five city loops.

All bus stops have QR codes that link to live bus times and service updates. CAT bus stops have a screen that indicates the number of minutes until the next service arrives. A CAT <u>network map and timetable</u> is available as a downloadable PDF.

A Journey Planner page is available on the Transperth website, and the Transperth app is available to download.
